

Early felling will enable the hard forest edge to be withdrawn from the nature reserve and to provide more 'naturalistic' edges with open ground and upland heathland.

Veteran trees and standing deadwood will be recruited in previously failed areas of plantation.

Heathland corridors will be established in the later phase once the plantation reaches economic maturity.

Thinning will be considered in the first period of the plan subject to assessment.

Areas of plantation retained as natural reserve where impacts of harvesting would be detrimental by surrounding ecology. These areas provide 'refuge' for nesting and foraging birds eg Crossbill.

Continuous forest cover will be maintained within the mixed conifer in the visually important Sulby valley and riparian area. These areas will be managed as LISS in the next and future rotations.

Further NBL encouraged into open ground areas

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

A mosaic of open shrubby habitat will be established adjacent to the main plantation, serving as a transitional zone that bridges heathland vegetation and the plantation canopy

Broadleaf buffers and open heath will be established along the edge of plantations to reduce the risk of fire entering the forest and provide edge habitat diversity for birds.

Retained mixed conifer managed as LISS will provide continuous forest cover and interest in visually sensitive areas open to ramblage.

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
